Consider the installation of three-way stop signs at the intersection of Harvest Hills Boulevard and NW 98th Street.

Consider the installation of three-way stop signs at the intersection of Independence Avenue and SW 96th Street.

Consider the installation of following traffic control devices in the vicinity of the Westminster School:
1. NW 44th Street, east of Lee Avenue (in front of the middle school), installation of “No Parking, 7:45 am to 8:45 am and 3:00 pm to 4:00 pm, Monday through Friday” signs, bothsides;
 2. NW 44th Street, west of Lee Avenue (in front of the primary school division), installation of “No Parking, 8:00 am to 4:00 pm, Monday through Friday” signs, southside;
 3. Lee Avenue and NW 45th Street, installation of four-way stop signs;
 4. Re-designation of existing school zones around Westminster School:
 - a. Extend “When Flashing” school zone boundary on Shartel Avenue from the current designation from NW 43rd Street to NW 46th Street to the proposed from NW 42nd Street to NW 46th Street;
 - b. Install “When Flashing” school zone on Walker from NW 42nd Street to NW 45th Street (north intersection);
 - c. Extending “When Children are Present” school zone on Lee Avenue, from the current designation from NW 42nd Street to NW 44th Street to the proposed from NW 42nd Street to NW 47th Street;
 - d. Extending “When Children are Present” school zone on NW 42nd Street, from the current designation from Walker Avenue to east of Lee Avenue to the proposed from Walker Avenue to Shartel Avenue;
 - e. Extending “When Children are Present” school zone on NW 43rd Street, from the current designation from Shartel Avenue to Lee Avenue to the proposed from Francis Avenue to Walker Avenue;
 - f. Extending “When Children are Present” school zone on NW 44th Street, from the current designation from Shartel Avenue to east of Lee Avenue (front of the middle school) to the proposed from Francis Avenue to Walker Avenue;
 - g. Install “When Children are Present” school zone on NW 45th Street from Shartel Avenue to Walker Avenue, and;

Consider changing the existing “When Children Are Present” school zone signs to “When Flashing” school zone lights on Classen Drive, from NW 13th Street to NW 11th Street.

Consider the removal of one parking meter and the installation of one handicap parking space on NW 19th Street, approximately 50 feet east of Classen Boulevard, northside.

- I. Matthew F. Madison, Service Center Manager, Oklahoma Service Center, Public Buildings Service, 215 Dean A. McGee Avenue, Room 524, 73102. (Ward 6)
Consider the installation of parking meters around the new federal building complex:
