1% FOR ART ORDINANCE

- Adopted by OKC Council in 2009
- 1% of the budgeted **CONSTRUCTION COST** shall be allocated for works of art
- City-owned buildings, parks and trails



SOURCES AND USES OF FUNDS

- Restrictions by State law for most sources
- Art selection process
- Administration costs
- Certain artwork maintenance
- Purchase, transport, and installation of works of art

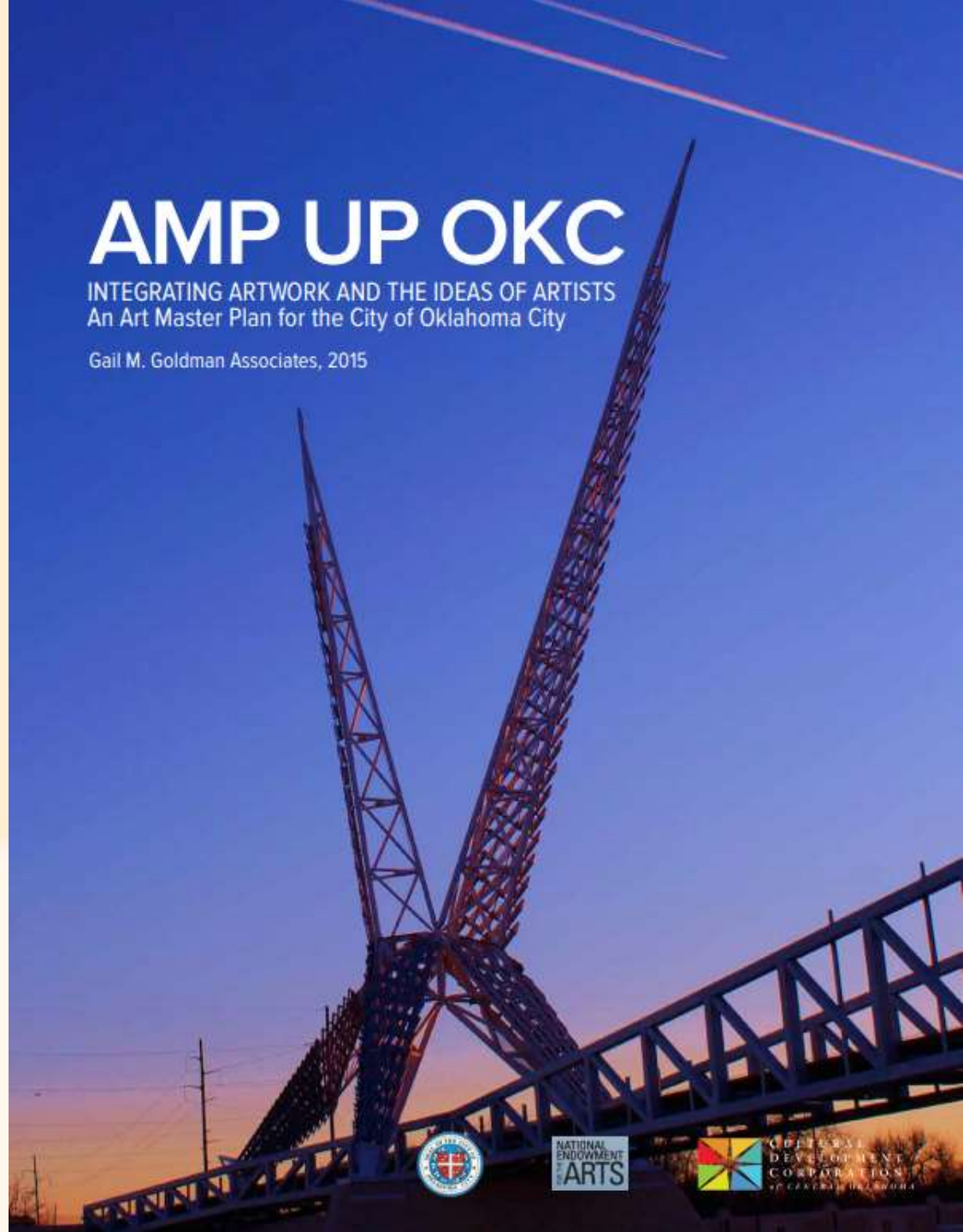
